Japan-Philippines relations making remarkable advances

As Japan and the Philippines approach their 70th anniversary of friendship in 2026, Japanese Ambassador to the Philippines Kazuya Endo shared his thoughts on the continuing evolution of their strategic bilateral relationship.

"In recent years, Japan-Philippines relations have made remarkable progress in various areas such as security, economy and people-to-people exchanges," he said. "Our ties have grown from strength to strength, strategically embracing realities toward mutual prosperity.

On defense cooperation, the Philippines became one of the recipients of Japan's Official Security Assistance and is the only country to be granted OSA funding for two consecutive years.

"Through this scheme, Japan has steadily supported the Philippines with military and defense equipment transfers to the Philippine Navy and Philippine Air Force," Endo noted. Referring to maritime cooperative activity, he also
